

2024 DISASTER CALFRESH FOOD ASSISTANCE





Disaster CalFresh is for anyone who lived or worked in San Diego County and:

- Was impacted during Jan 21 through Feb 19, 2024.
- Could not work or get paid because of the disaster.
- Had their home or workplace damaged because of the disaster
- Had disaster-related costs (including food loss, shelter, and evacuation costs).

If you are already receiving CalFresh food benefits, you are NOT eligible for Disaster CalFresh

How much could I get?

- Everyone will receive a minimum of \$291, potentially more, depending on household size.
- For example, a household of two may qualify for a one-time food benefit of \$535 if their monthly available income & resources for the affected dates is less than \$2,514 after considering the impact of the disaster on their household.



Can I apply for Disaster CalFresh if I am an undocumented individual?

• YES! You don't need a social security number to apply for Disaster CalFresh.



Is Disaster CalFresh considered a public benefit for public charge?

• Disaster CalFresh is <u>NOT</u> a public benefit <u>considered</u> for <u>public charge</u>.
